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**ABOUT:** Ava Roy is the Founding Artistic Director of *We Players* (established in 2000, incorporated as a 501c3 in 2012). Since 2008, she has pioneered unique partnerships with the National Park Service, the California State Park system, and San Francisco Recreation and Parks, creating large-scale performances at park sites throughout the Bay Area including Alcatraz island, Angel Island, Sutro Baths, The Palace of Fine Arts and many more. Her unique style of interactive, site-integrated performance aims to highlight the historical and natural treasures of local landscapes and encourage new ways of experiencing and appreciating these places. She is deeply inspired by the entrenched histories and energies of each site, as well as the natural environment. Ava is an alumna of Stanford University.

Class description: *Insights in Site* examines how we shift from interloper to belonging through performative interactions with each other, our communities, and broader society. Students will evaluate and activate public space through exploratory site analysis informed by intersectional experiences and multi-disciplinary activations. This class will consider race, gender, class and ecology to (re)define common ground for accessible public space. How might equity-based response and analysis guide a reimagination of urban public space? How might we upend traditional practices of site design towards an integrative understanding of public space? Using theatre as metaphor, and performance as a conduit of exploration, students will conduct integrative site analysis through a series of site visits that have been settings for performances by theatre company We Players. Students will develop sensory and somatic analysis, understand the permissions processes, and create and activate site-specific interventions.
