## We Players adapts 'Beowulf' for the great outdoors



We Players' "Beowulf" doesn't have a consistent start time; you're encouraged to arrive at 5:45 p.m. at the San Francisco Maritime Museum so that you can be ready whenever the show starts, which is at sunset on the dot.

In addition to its usual tips — the participatory, outdoor, site-specific theater company always advises its audience members to dress warmly, in layers and comfortable shoes - We Players has a further request of its "Beowulf" spectators: wear all black. "We are in mourning," its website explains.

Directors Ava Roy and Shinichi Iova-Koga adapted the show from the Old English epic poem in collaboration with Rova Saxophone Quartet and inkBoat Physical Theatre and Dance, in addition to We Players. Expect warriors who battle to rescue Denmark from monsters, a snack break in a "mead hall" with performers, and the dramatic selfsacrifice of an aging king.
